



■ Redemption Machines Must Now Be Licensed

TO: License Holders of Coin-Operated Amusement Devices

Effective May 8, 1992, redemption machines must be licensed.

What is a redemption machine?

A redemption machine is an amusement device which provides a game allowing one or more players to propel any object toward any target under the following conditions:

- 1 the outcome of the game is determined mainly by the player's skill;
- 2 a prize is awarded based only upon whether the player achieved the object of the game;
- 3 only prizes of merchandise are awarded;
- 4 the average wholesale value of the prize for single play is not greater than either
 - \$5 or
 - seven times the cost for a single play of the game,
 whichever is less; and

- 5 the redemption value of individual tickets, tokens, or other units of value awarded does not exceed the amount charged for a single play of the game.

How do I license my redemption machines?

We are enclosing Form RCOA-2, Coin-Operated Amusement Device Application for License. Please complete the application and mail it to us immediately.

What happens if I don't get licenses for my redemption machines?

You must obtain a license for each redemption machine before putting it into service. If you fail to obtain a license, you are liable for

- penalty and
- possible confiscation of any unlicensed machines.
